The 9 Major Research Areas in Social Psychology

Affect (how you feel about the object) Behavior (how you act, actions towards an object), Cognition (how you think about an object) self-affirmation theory. A theory that (a) people often experience a self-image threat, after engaging in an undesirable behavior; and (b) they can compensate by affirming another aspect of the self.
